
Florida's largest financial assistance program for water infrastructure, capitalized by federal grants through EPA

- ~\$270 million per year total for Clean Water and Drinking Water
- Interest rates on loans are below market rates and vary based on the economic status of community














Map of CWSRF & DWSRF Proj





Nonpoint Source Program Grants

Federal and state funding for projects that reduce pollution from nonpoint sources, particularly to address impaired waterbodies and meet restoration goals related to TMDLs and restoration plans

 ~\$8 million per year total, EPA 319(h) federal funding and state TMDL funding

Water & Springs Restoration

Managing grant agreements for springs restoration and legislative water projects

- More than \$291 million in state funds invested for springs restoration projects
- 189 springs projects focused on water quality and quantity for springs
